Switching gears...

Thank you to our board for approving the contract with Leadership Associates a couple of months back in support of reviewing, assessing, and updating our district's strategic plan. With the guidance of Mr. Jim Brown from Leadership Associates, the Oversight Team met this week to review a timeline to engage with our community stakeholders as our partners in this work.

As part of this time intensive process, we look to review the current plan, celebrate accomplishments, and assign performance measures to the updated plan as a whole. Such measures are what a superintendent's performance is measured on as well. More information to come as we move forward with the process. A formal introduction of this important work will soon be out to all our stakeholders.

UTILIZATION OF FISCAL CAPITAL

Last May, I had shared that statewide student enrollment in the K-12 setting is down significantly. This follows a steady decline in public school enrollment statewide since 2014–15.

I am thrilled to report our fall enrollment numbers as of today, 993.

Last year this time, our enrollment count was at 954.

Having confirmed with our IT folks, our enrollment for the opening of schools, as of today is.

We still have quite a few families that have started the "online enrollment" process that have yet to complete the full registration process. They are being reached out for additional guidance and support.

We've had an influx of inter-district permits coming to us from neighboring districts.

The Davis Demographics report, based on the statistical attrition had us opening at 902 students, fall 2022.

It is our hope that we hit the 1,000 mark by August 17th, the first day of school.

This concludes my report for the evening, thank you.

COVID Report:

- Last week (Monday-Sunday) there were 23 cases of COVID in the Acton-Agua Dulce surrounding area.
- Over the summer we had 14 staff members test positive while on campus.
- Test kits will be available at each site.
- On Tuesday, the health team had set up their 1st Vaccine Clinic at High Desert and we gave 4 Tdap, 1 HPV, and 0 COVID immunizations.
- Our next clinic will be on August 30th from 2-4 at the District Office MPR.
- Masks will not be required unless there is classroom exposure.
- OSHA still has a requirement for unvaccinated staff to be COVID tested weekly, but now they are able to conduct a self-read COVID test at home and upload it into the Primary Health Platform.
