COVID Report:

• I'd like to provide an up to date COVID report, data pulled from LACDPH. 18,822 new cases as reported to LACDPH as of January 25th as compared to 43,582 new cases for January 10th as reported at our last board meeting. A significant surge since our last board meeting, approximately a month ago.

The testing positivity rate, a 7-day average for the week of January 18th is at 16.61% as compared to the week of January 3rd which came in at 22.64%.

I'd like to stress that our district's positivity rate hovers near 27% down from 29% during the week of January 4th.

Once again, I would like to remind our families, the importance of a self-check at home prior to students arriving on campus. Please look for symptoms such as a cough, fever, and shortness of breath.

Also, we have moved forward with a purchase order of an additional 2,500 antigen test kits that will be made available to our families very soon once we receive shipment.
