HDS Hawks SOAR on ELPAC Assessment To reclassify an English Learner (EL) student, CA requires them to achieve a high score (4 or 5) on a standardized English language proficiency assessment like the ELPAC, demonstrate strong academic performance compared to their English proficient peers, receive positive teacher evaluations, and undergo parent consultation before being considered fluent in English and no longer needing EL services; essentially, meeting criteria based on language proficiency testing, academic performance, teacher input, and parent involvement.

AADUSD School Board honored our EL students who reclassified this past school year. High Desert had the most students reclassified in the school district, with 31% of students able to reclassify. Congratulations:


