- EL (English Language) Team also working to complete the Redesignation process and monitor students' progress
- After School Tutoring at Vasquez High School
- Fully teacher supported independent study
- Information and Professional Development for Tier 1 supports in general education classrooms
- UDL (Universal Design for Learning) Support Platforms including Text Help and Immersive Reader.



What is an ambassador program?

A Parent Ambassador program is an effective way for schools to take their natural advocates, or natural promoters- the people who already are talking about the school/school district and spreading positive word of mouth- and give them tools and processes that make them even more effective.

Who should ideally be involved in an ambassador program?



There are two groups that should be involved. Parent and alumni. Out of the groups, alumni ambassadors are often the most underutilized. However they can definitely bring a lot of value to the program. They can speak to the outcomes they've had as a result of attending our schools. They can also answer a question that a lot of prospective families have, which is "what's in it for me?"

Why are ambassador programs so important for schools?

The number one reason they're so important is that, for most schools, word of mouth is the number one way that new and prospective families find out and inquire about a school. The other reason they're effective is that our ambassadors will have the ability to authentically communicating the unique values of our schools and school district.

What criteria did you use to select ambassadors?

We have many parents who are already doing much of the work of an ambassador. We want to take these efforts and organize them by providing clear strategies and goals and enabling them to see additional successes through their efforts.

What roles and responsibilities have you given your parent ambassadors?

Our parent ambassadors may be involved in the following areas: Broad Community Relations, Realtor Relations, and Broad Retention/Recruitment. Additional topics to be determined.

At the meetings, support will be provided by the district office in order to enhance communication along with the necessary tools to be successful.


