Winter sports for the 23-24 school year have concluded.

The boys' soccer team secured second place in the league and qualified for CIF playoffs for the 12th consecutive year. Similarly, the girls' soccer team also claimed second place in their league, earned a spot in CIF playoffs, and reached the third round before bowing out.



Despite not making it to CIF, boys' basketball had a commendable season, showing promising progress towards contending for a league title next season.

On the other hand, girls' basketball enjoyed a historic campaign, finishing fourth in the league and making it to the CIF playoffs. They reached the semifinals before losing to the eventual champions, AV High School.

Furthermore, they made history by qualifying for the California State Basketball Tournament, though they were eliminated in the first round. This achievement marks the first time a team from Vasquez High School has qualified for the state championship.
