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
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Fall reflection: Eric Sahakian, Ed.D.- AADUSD Superintendent


High Desert School

The drill lasted approximately 20 minutes was designed to ensure that all staff and students are well-prepared for emergencies. Participating in the Great ShakeOut is crucial for high schools for several reasons:

Earthquake Preparedness: The event helps students and staff practice essential safety measures during an earthquake, such as "Drop, Cover, and Hold On." This preparedness can save lives and reduce injuries.

Building Awareness: It raises awareness about the risks associated with earthquakes and the importance of being ready. Students learn about emergency kits, communication plans, and evacuation routes.

Community Engagement: Involving students in the ShakeOut fosters a sense of community and responsibility. Schools can collaborate with local emergency services, promoting a culture of safety that extends beyond the classroom.

High Desert Athletics is thriving this school year! Setting a new school record, we have over 75 student athletes competing on our Fall sports teams (Boys Varsity Volleyball, Girls Varsity Volleyball, Cross Country, JV Boys Soccer, JV Girls Basketball, and Spirit Squad).
