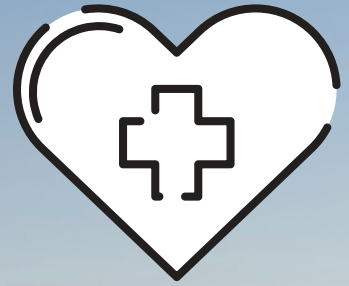

Introducing WeCare AADUSD



WeCare AADUSD: Mental Health Program

Services

The AADUSD Mental Health Program provides direct mental health therapy to students: face-to-face therapeutic sessions, and groups; training to all AADUSD staff on mental health and wellness psycho-education.

No Service Fees

The AADUSD received two grants: from the U.S. Department of Education and the U.S. Department of Justice.

The AADUSD Mental Health Program services are free of charge for all Acton–Agua Dulce Students who are referred to the program.

*WeCare AADUSD is considered a Tier 3 as it relates to PBIS (Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports): At Tier 3, students receive more intensive, individualized support to improve their behavioral and academic outcomes. At this level, schools rely on formal assessments to determine a student's need.

*WeCare AADUSD cannot meet with students to provide mental health services without the consent from the parent/guardian/legal rights holder.

Referral Process

Parents, Teachers, School Administration, and staff can refer a student to receive mental health services and students can self-refer through AADUSD Mental Health Program. All parents or legal guardians will be contacted upon receiving the referral for the student and the mental health rights holder for the student must sign a consent form for the student to receive mental health services. UPDATE:


