Q & A with our new Assistant Superintendent

O: Welcome to AADUSD! You come to AADUSD as our Assistant Superintendent of Business Services. What were your previous positions? A: Over the past 10 years I have held a variety of positions at Newhall School District in Santa Clarita. I began as a Fiscal Services Accountant in 2012, where I was responsible for Accounts Payable for the District. After two years I was promoted to Business Services Coordinator where I was tasked with the purchase of everything from pencils to asphalt. In 2018, I was promoted to Assistant Director of Business Services. During this time I oversaw the Accounts Payable, Accounts Receivable, Purchasing and Attendance functions for the District. I also assisted the Director of Fiscal Services in preparing the District's budget. From May 2020 to March 2023, I was Newhall School District's Director of Business and Fiscal Services, where I was in charge of the entire Fiscal Services Department which added Payroll to the other areas I previously handled.





Q: What attracted you to fiscal services/education as a career?

A: I was attracted to the fiscal services career because I enjoyed math and the business application of it. I was introduced to the education world because my mom worked in payroll for Saugus Union School District. After I graduated high school I got a job at Saugus as a Warehouse Helper where I completed the daily intra-district mail.

Q: What led you to move into administration?

A: When I was young and through high school I played soccer and I typically ended up being the leader or captain of the team. Also during my college career I had many group projects and I always tended to be the leader of the group. So I think that I naturally gravitated towards leadership or administration as I wanted to guide and teach those around me.

Q: What attracted you to the position of Assistant Supt. of Business Svcs.?

A: During my time at Saugus I always had great respect for their Assistant Superintendent of Business, Robert "Bob" Cutting. He was so knowledgeable and a great people person and I told myself from that point that I wanted to model myself after him.

Q: Could you tell us what your main day-to-day responsibilities would entail?


A: The main day-to-day responsibilities of the Assistant Superintendent of Business Services is to make sure that the District operates as smoothly and efficiently as possible so that the teachers, students and administration can focus on learning and education. This includes overseeing the District's Fiscal, Maintenance, Technology, Custodial, Transportation, and Nutritional Services Departments.

Q: Is there anything miscellaneous you'd like to share about yourself — family, interests outside of your job, favorite books, movies, sports teams, etc.?

A: I have a wonderful wife and two daughters aged 5 and 2. I am a big hockey fan and supporter of the Los Angeles Kings. I also play ice hockey and am the team captain for an adult league team at The Cube in Santa Clarita. In my free time I enjoy spending time with my family and friends on our boat at Lake Mead.



U.S. Department of Education Awards AADUSD



Research shows a direct correlation between student well-being and student achievement.

On January 5th, AADUSD received notification of a grant being awarded through the U.S. Department of Education. The superintendent's office submitted the grant Request For Proposal back in early November.

Per the Project Director at the U.S. Department of Education, "This year's competition was highly competitive; we received more than 185 applications and made only 67 awards. Our application was among the highest-scoring applications received and therefore recommended for funding."

AADUSD will embark on the grant initiatives with the following projects:

- Hiring of 1 full-time LCSW- Licensed Clinical Social Worker (this would be in addition to the 1 full-time LCSW being hired through the U.S. Dept. of Justice grant recently awarded)
- Hiring of 3 full-time MSWs- Master of Social Workers
- Supervision of 3 Social Worker Interns
- Purchasing an Anonymous Reporting Solution platform for the district website and its coordination
- Purchasing of Suicide Prevention Modules (curriculum to be facilitated by the social worker team)
- Purchasing "Bounce Back" which is a cognitive-behavioral, skills-based group intervention aimed at relieving symptoms of child anxiety and depression among elementary school children (ages 5-11) who have been exposed to traumatic events.

Funding amount awarded: \$3.6 million over the course of the grant's duration which is 5 years.

The High Desert Hawk student-athletes have had a busy winter! In November, the Silver League implemented a trial season of co-ed flag football. Led by volunteer coaches Pat Tucker and Gina Botton, the Hawks had a fantastic time learning the game. February kicked off the soccer season. Both soccer teams hope to qualify for the Silver League Championship Tournament which will take place on Thursday, March 16th at Vasquez High School. Immediately, following the conclusion of soccer, the basketball season will begin. New coaches Leonard Rivas and Amy Hagiu are actively preparing for basketball tryouts. Cheering and supporting Hawk athletes during various games are the Spirit Squad members. Adaliz Giron had a vision to bring together enthusiastic students to cheer on and support the athletes. Under her tutelage, the spirit squad has added a warm, spirited presence to volleyball, flag football, and soccer games.

VHS had an amazing winter season. For the first time in school history, all four sports, (girls and boys basketball, and girls and boys soccer) made CIF playoffs. That has never been accomplished during any sporting season. To have both basketball teams and soccer teams qualify is truly a remarkable achievement in light of the COVID shut down.


The girls basketball team had the most remarkable season. They finished 13-8, 3rd in the league. No girls' basketball team in VHS history has ever had a winning record. In addition, they also return all their starters except one for next season and they are poised to challenge for a league title Coach EJ did an amazing job rebuilding this program and deserves a ton of praise. The future looks bright for this young team for the next few years.

Boys basketball had a dramatic turnaround compared to last season. Last year the team was 1-19 and this season they were 13-16. They also qualified for the quarter-finals in the CIF playoffs this season. This is the second time in the last four years, that Brody Villasenor and Adam Frank have pushed their team to the quarterfinals. No other duo has accomplished this feat ever in VHS basketball history. We are graduating five seniors this year and Coach Mario will have a tough time finding a team that played as hard as the boys did this year.

Girls Soccer and Boys Soccer

Girls' and Boys' soccer have been the two most successful sports in VHS history. Girls' soccer was 13-6-1 and finished 3rd in the league this year They qualified for the playoffs and were eliminated in the first round. The boys' team finished second in league play with a 13-4-2 record. They qualified for playoffs and were eliminated in the second round. The Vasquez Boy's and Girl's Soccer Teams have proudly represented Vasquez High School in CIF. The Boys have made it to CIF Southern Section playoffs for the last 13 years, while the Girls have a streak of 15 years in a row. Coach Terry and Coach Pete are outstanding coaches and built programs based on respect and hard work.
