Meadowlark's Open House was held on June 1st had an amazing turnout by the ML community. Thank you parents, staff, and ML's PTO for all of their efforts.











#### Meadowlark ES Shines!


Meadowlark is on its way to setting up a "Meadowlark Morning News" Students are learning a lot about technology and trouble shooting.

Addition of New Signature Programs: Check it Out

#### <u>Paper</u>

Paper provides schools with unlimited access to a variety of services through a device-agnostic, secure, Educational Support System (ESS). With Paper, students receive Unlimited 24/7 One-on-one Tutoring for all subjects, delivered by a live educator through Paper's Classroom in both English and Spanish.

Each online educator is a Paper Employee who is trained in the Socratic teaching method and undergoes a criminal background check prior to employment. Paper also provides students with Essay Review, where students can upload any piece of written work and receive an annotated version of their work within twenty-four hours. Paper will provide support to our 6th-12th grade students.

#### Career Connections

Students learn basic and intermediate carpentry skills in commercial and residential construction, and the essentials of construction site safety. The program also includes training in employability skills including goal setting, positive attitude, punctuality, teamwork, and taking initiative.

The aim here is to provide continuity of career technical education exposure and opportunities through the scaffolding of innovative instruction, i.e. Makerspace (Meadowlark), Paxton Patterson (High Desert), and Career Connection (aka SWRCC/Career Connections, at VHS).

## Academics: TOSA Team Update



The <u>TOSA (Teachers On Special Assignment) Team</u> have been focused on organizational tasks, school wide schedules, planning for summer task force meetings, etc. This year they worked on the following:

- Evidence based reading intervention for grades K-4
- Improving and supporting SEL (Social Emotional Learning) supports for Tier
   1 classroom instruction
- Tier 3 support for behavior, academics, and social emotional
- We have implemented Branching Minds in a basic way with plans to expand it's usage to track student needs and evidence based supports provided
- We created a web-based staff resource for SST (Student Success Teams)
   that is posted to the website
- We are building a full website of staff resources
- As a team we worked on tasks related to 2:1:2 schedules, Summer school, textbook adoption, PBIS (Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports)
- · We instituted universal screeners for both SEL and academics
- We have a goal to universally screen students for GATE (Gifted & Talented Education) at 3rd grade, beginning next year (as well as working on a plan for capturing those students who past that screening window)
- We had 100% of all EL (English Learners) students complete ELPAC (English Language Proficiency Assessments for California) testing this year.

The 2021-2022 VHS sports season concluded when softball, baseball, swim, and track completed their last matches.

The swim team had their best season in many years with two athletes, Kaden Bennett and Flavio Orlando qualifying for CIF. The team finished second in the league and coach Kianna Harris was named coach of the year for the Heritage League. This is the fourth coach this spring season to win this honor.


