AADUSD is stronger together!

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
2023 Summer School

# AADUSD Educational Services Update



Spring Highlights -

#### MTSS Team

The district-wide Multi-Tiered System of Supports (MTSS) team, meets weekly and brings together, the assistant superintendent, site administrators, counselors, TOSAs (Teacher on Special Assignment), and teacher leaders and plays a pivotal role in providing comprehensive learning support to students across all tiers. This dedicated team collaboratively works to implement evidence-based practices that address the diverse needs of our student population. By leveraging their collective expertise and experience, they create a robust framework that encompasses academic, behavioral, and social-emotional support. The team has worked to implement Universal Screening tools, evidence based learning intervention programs, improved and vertically aligned SST (Student Success Teams) procedures, and has engaged in ongoing assessment, data analysis, and intervention planning. Their unwavering commitment to fostering an inclusive and supportive learning environment empowers students to thrive academically and emotionally, setting them on a path towards long-term success.

#### New Teacher Induction

AADUSD New Teacher Induction hosted its first annual Colloquium to celebrate the achievements of our candidates and coaches. Our partnership with RCOE Center for Teacher Innovation in our new teacher induction program has proven to be immensely valuable in guiding and supporting our new educators. New teacher induction is a two year program through which preliminary teachers are able to clear their teaching credential through expanded learning, inquiry, and coaching. With a total of eight candidates enrolled, we have witnessed remarkable achievements. Five candidates successfully completed the induction process at the end of this year. Two of them demonstrated exceptional dedication and aptitude in prior school years, making them eligible for the one-year early completion track, while three candidates completed the second year, demonstrating their unwavering commitment to professional growth. Remarkably, four out of the five candidates have met all the requirements and have already applied for their Professional Clear Credential. Additionally, two candidates successfully completed the first year of the program, and one candidate made significant progress despite joining midyear. Those three candidates will have the opportunity to complete year 2 of induction in the 2023-24 school year. Undoubtedly, this program has empowered our new teachers, equipping them with the skills and knowledge necessary for a successful career in education.

### <u>LCAP</u>

The annual revision of the Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) serves as a crucial step in our commitment to educational excellence. Instructional TOSAs, Alexa Lepp and Nicole Chun, and Counselor, Nicole Salsedo, joined district admin to draft the LCAP update for the 2022–23. Each year, we engage in a comprehensive review process to ensure that our LCAP accurately reflects the evolving needs and aspirations of our students, families, and community. This revision involves gathering input from various education partners, including teachers, parents, administrators, and community members, through surveys, meetings, and forums. By considering their valuable perspectives and insights, we can make informed decisions and prioritize resources effectively. The annual revision of the LCAP enables us to adapt our strategies, set ambitious goals, and allocate resources in a manner that supports equitable access to quality education and fosters student success. Our dedication to this iterative process is a testament to our unwavering commitment to providing an inclusive and impactful educational experience for all.

#### Textbook Adoption

We are thankful for the diligent efforts of our adoption committee, Nicole Chun, Amanda Stillwell, Jay Knee, and Aaron Zwirn, in selecting and recommending a new history social science curriculum. With representative teachers from elementary, middle, and high school, the committee embarked on a thorough evaluation process to identify a curriculum that aligns with our educational goals and values. Their extensive research, analysis, piloting, and collaborative discussions ensured that the recommended curriculum meets the rigorous academic standards.

#### <u>SOAR</u>

The SOAR early reading intervention program, coordinated by TOSA Candice Palacios, has emerged successful in fostering literacy skills among our students. Through the utilization of the Sonday system, a science of reading structured literacy program, participating students receive daily intensive instruction in phonemic awareness, a fundamental aspect of reading development. The results have been remarkable, as students enrolled in the program have exhibited substantial growth on the BPST (Basic Phonics Skills Test) assessments. The combination of Candice Palacios' coordination and the evidence-based instructional approach has proven to be a winning formula for improving reading abilities. The SOAR early reading intervention program stands as a shining example of our commitment to providing targeted support that equips students with the foundational skills necessary for lifelong success in reading and beyond.

With that said, the updated Strategic Plan will be a live document that would incorporate not only our strategic goals, but action items and tasks with timelines to assess our efforts.


Initially, the Writing Team proposed presenting the final draft to the Development Team in late May and then to our school board in June.
