Wednesday, September 18, 3:30 - 4:30 pm

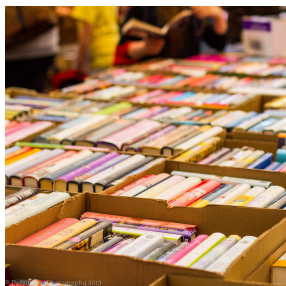
Explore science, technology, and arts and make your own stop action movie. We supply the cameras and materials for you to create a digital movie masterpiece. Designed for ages 6 - 13.
