Wednesday, August 14, 3:30 – 4:30 pm

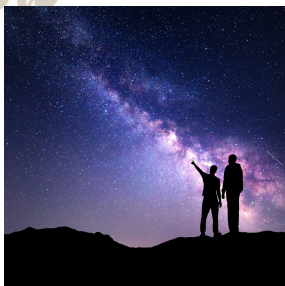
