## Stanley Hotel - Colorado



# **Halloween Baking Recipes**

**Spider cookies: 1)** Melt the chocolate in a double boiler or in the microwave, stirring every 30 seconds until smooth and melty. Transfer the chocolate to a piping bag or Ziploc bag with a tiny bit of the end snipped off. 2) Place a tiny bit of melted chocolate in the middle of a peanut butter cookie then press a mini peanut butter cup on top. Using the piping bag, create 8 "legs" with the chocolate, 4 on each side. Repeat with remaining cookies. 3) Use a bit of the melted chocolate on the front of the Reese's peanut butter cup and place 2 mini candy eyeballs on top, pressing them on, 12 peanut butter cookies (store-bought or homemade), 12 mini Reese's peanut butter cups, 1/4 cup semi-sweet chocolate melted, 24 mini candy eyeballs.

Rice Crispy Monsters: 1) 6 oz candy melts (in any color), 8 Rice Krispie squares (homemade or store bought), 1/4 cup assorted candy eyeballs, sprinkles for decorating. 2) Line a baking sheet with parchment paper and set aside. In a microwave-safe bowl, melt the candy melts in the microwave in 30-second increments, at 70% power, stirring each time until smooth. Stir until smooth. 3) Holding the end of a Rice Krispie square, dip it into the melted chocolate until it's covered 3/4 with chocolate. Hold it up to let the excess chocolate drip off. Place the square on the baking sheet. Immediately press in various candy eyeballs, and add the sprinkles, if using. Repeat with remaining squares. Place the squares in the fridge for 10 minutes until the chocolate is hardened.

**Poison Apple Punch: 1)** Smash the ginger slices with the flat side of a chef's knife and transfer to a medium saucepan. 2) Add the apple cider, orange zest, lemon zest, cinnamon sticks and cloves. Bring to a simmer over medium heat. Simmer for 10 minutes, then strain through a fine-mesh sieve into a pitcher. 3) Let cool to room temperature, then refrigerate until chilled, about 1 hour. 4) Poke holes in the apple wedges with a chopstick or skewer and insert a gummy worm into each. 5) Add the cranberry-apple juice and whiskey, if using, to the punch. #### **Eastern State Penitentiary** - Philadelphia

Haunted prisons are nothing new, but Eastern State Penitentiary is different from any other. It was known for three things. The first being its strange treatment of prisoners, which forced them to wear masks and stay isolated during their stay. The second, it's most infamous resident, Al Capone. And of course, the many claims of ghostly sightings from workers, janitors, and prisoners alike. One of the prisoners who claimed to have seen a spectral being was Al Capone himself, who swore he was haunted by one of the victims of the St. Valentine's Day Massacre.

#### **The Conjuring house -** Rhode Island

Aka "The Old Arnold Estate", is a colonial house built in 1736 known for its paranormal activity. This house is located in Harrisville, Rhode Island, and was made famous by the Conjuring movie in 2013 which depicted the Perron family that lived there in the 1970's. The paranormal activity goes back to the 1700's when the spirits of native tribes remained in the land till today. From time to time, people can see these spirits visiting the house and land from underground. The house was built on 8.5 acres beside a river, forest, open fields and is surrounded by stone walls. Andrea Perron, one of the five daughters of the Perron family, describes her home as "a portal cleverly disguised as a farmhouse." Since the house was opened to the public in 2019, thousands of people have been to the attraction and have witnessed and experienced the famous paranormal activity.

#### The Catacombs - Paris

were built in the 18th century due to major health problems tied to the city's cemeteries. The leaders of Paris then had the decision to transfer the bodies from the cemeteries to the underground. Covering a huge area, the Catacombs of Paris stretch over 174 miles underneath Paris. However, only a small part of the catacombs is open to the public.
